about christ's death and resurrection thereby allowing him to assert that the releasing of the body from the power of sin is a result of crucifixion this crucifixion is the condemnation inflicted on our past lives in the age inaugurated by adam's sin and this is such a horrible event that believers have to stay away from sin since sin leads to such punishment in contrast hope is presented in the context of burial the believers burial with christ points to the fact that they are part of christ's family and this is accomplished by the overwhelming action of god by which he pushes us toward the event of christ's death an act pictured in baptism it is this burial with christ that allows believers to share with christ in newness of life
